Iconic Palacio Salvo opened in 1925 and was the tallest building in South America for many years.

Established by the Spanish in 1726, the European influence on Montevideo is visible today in its art and architecture. Its location at the mouth of the River Plate established the city as an important port and naval base.



Teatro Solís, inaugurated in 1856, is South America's oldest theatre.

Perhaps as a result of the limits placed on the arts during the 1973 - 1985 military rule, these days Montevideo has a particularly strong creative arts scene which celebrates its historical figures while embracing modernity and creativity. 19th century painter Juan Manuel Blanes and contemporary painter and sculptor Carlos Paéz Vilaró stand out in visual arts, while classical music and tango fans can find out about the lives of famous Uruguayans Eduardo Fabini, Gerardo Matos Rodriguez and Carlos Gardel.

Combining Spanish with cultural excursions is the perfect way to accelerate your learning and to get to know this fascinating country.
